### Adult Faith Formation - "And He began to teach them ...

Within the Sermon on the Mount from the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus gives us the remarkably timeless teachings known as The Beatitudes. While they are powerfully simple reminders of the promises of living the Christian life, each of them merits in-depth analysis to help us apply them practically in our own journeys of faith. This series will examine the meanings ascribed to each of The Beatitudes, and what we can learn from the Saints who have modeled them for us!

#### January 16: WELCOME BACK BREAKFAST

January 23: The Beatitudes: Gospel Context and Interpretations What is the context and setting of Jesus' famous teaching? How have The Beatitudes been interpreted, applied, and asserted influence in history?

January 30: The First Beatitude: Blessed are the poor in spirit

We are blessed when we recognize our own complete dependence upon God, and therefore seek Him in others.

February 6: The Second Beatitude: Blessed are those who mourn

Mourning is part of the human condition, but the loss we mourn the most is our separation from God, so again, we turn to actively seeking Him.

February 13: The Third Beatitude: Blessed are the meek

We are called to model Christ's own humility. Church history is full of examples of the great Saints who show us this example.

February 20: The Fourth Beatitude: Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness

To seek the will of God, and not our own, is to hunger and thirst for what is truly our greatest need.

March 20: The Seventh Beatitude: Blessed are the peacemakers

God first loved us and reconciled us to Him, and we are called to model this reconciling love to everyone, in all circumstances.


April 3: The Eighth Beatitude: Blessed are those who are persecuted for the sake of justice:
