## St. Michael Chapel 20th Anniversary



Twenty years ago the parish was planning a celebration for the November 25, 1995 dedication of our new Chapel by Bishop William B. Friend.

The chapel was designed by Andrea Nagode, an architect from Houston, with the assistance of Shreveport architects, contractor and construction crews. Andrea also designed the altar and dedication plaques. The antique crucifix in the Chapel was a gift to the parish from the Haddad family in the 1920's and hung

in the Church below the choir loft until it was moved to serve as a focal point for the Chapel. The Sanctuary Lamp is identical to the Cathedral lamp and was originally commissioned by Mr. and Mrs. Camille Richardson, Sr. for the chapel at St. Vincent's Academy. When the chapel was demolished, Bishop Friend gave it to Rev. Albert Richardson who had hung it in his living room. He had been looking for a "home" for the lamp and generously donated it to the Chapel. Other items of note: the St. Michael window was created based on an image from the Honorable Thomas E. Stagg; the side stained glass windows were by the same studio, Lyn Hovey, and depict eight angels mentioned in the Bible; the two antique wooden panels forming the reredos were salvaged from an old church; the hand-carved medallion of the Holy Family, imported from Ortisei, Italy, was carved from one single piece of linden wood.

When you come into this chapel, remember that Our Lord Jesus Christ is here.

His Blessed Sacrament reserved for Holy Communion.
